



Body Armour

A rare cuirass or body-armor made of plaited cane. Fly River, Papua New Guinea, Melanesia. Woven cane. 42,5 x 36,5 x 29 cm. 19/20th century.

Collected in the field prior to 1910. Ex coll. : P.L. collection c. 1910; L.R. Hornshaw (1903-85), eldest son of B.L. Hornshaw, Australia; presented to a subsequent owner by L.R.H. on 14/3/1935. With a paper label stating "Cuirass or corselet, body protector against arrows Fly River New Guinea 1910, Pres. By L.R.H 14.3.35" on one side and "Body protector, Fly River New Guinea from P.L. collection (1910), Pres. By L.R.H. 1935" on the other.
